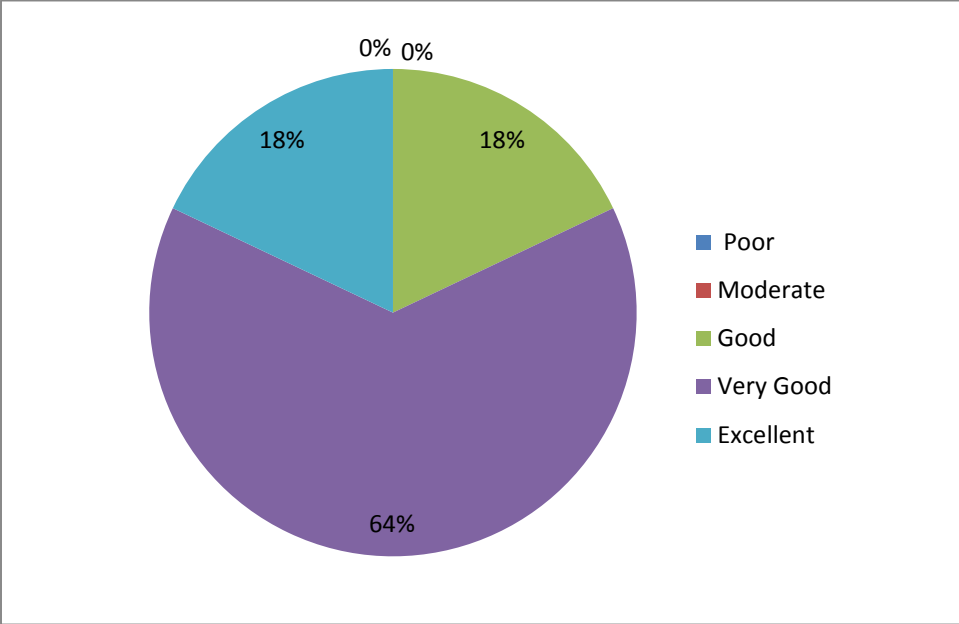

The highlights of this year's activities are

Disaster management:

- Volunteers Dhanashri Kolambkar and Preeti bhanushali trained girls at SNTD university state level camp.
- Our volunteers helped as demonstrators during various Government disaster mock-drills at kalyan, Mokhada. These activities were carried out under observation of Ex District coordinator, Prof. D. G. Phondekar.
- Training was given to our volunteers by Ex volunteer Jagdish Rajane in December in the college as well as during our residential camp.
- Thirty volunteers attended a one day workshop on disaster management held at S. K. Somaiya college on 29th January, 2011. This workshop was under the Swayam Project taken by Nirmala Niketan .

Gender equity

- A mega event, **Yuvak-yuvati Mela** was organized by our college in collaboration with NSS unit of University of Mumbai and NGO Akshara (a woman research centre) on 9th and 10th Feb 2011. An orientation was given to 32 volunteers on 1st feb 2011.

The aim of the mela is to create awareness about gender equity and women empowerment through games.

Volunteers carried out campaign for the same mela in campus as well as 38 colleges ranging from Dadar/Matunga to Ulhasnagar and Vashi.

Throughout, About 42 Volunteers worked in the mela for the two days event.

Street plays were carried out in the campus for awareness among youth about the mela.

Volunteers went every college and class in the Somaiya campus to make an awareness.

Nearly 2300 youngsters from various colleges, 80 teachers and about 60 Students of B. Ed and D.Ed College have visited the mela.

HIV awareness

- HIV awareness programme was renamed as Red Ribbon Club under the instruction of NAACO and reintroduced among college youth. The college comprise a club of 30 volunteers and worked in the area of HIV/AIDS awareness

- 4 volunteers from our college were sent for HIV/AIDS awareness workshop organized by MDACS on 30th-31st July 2010
- Blood donation and Thalassemia test were carried out on 30th July, 2010. 84 donors donated blood.
- Spreading of awareness along with HIV/AIDS ribbon for students throughout the campus on WORLD AIDS DAY.
- Street plays on HIV/AIDS awareness were carried out in campus as well as in the community.
- A street play demo was organized by Maitri group through MDACS on 12th January in the campus. On the same day a blood donation drive was organized by Somaiya trust along with Samarpan Blood Bank. Our volunteers participated in promotion of the same.
- A lecture and demonstration was carried out for RRC volunteers by senior volunteer Vedangi Amnekar on 21st February, 2011. Thirty volunteers were present

Save Electricity Campaign

The campaign was organized in Jan and Feb 2011.

Volunteers Visited their Neighbours and spread awareness about electricity conservation.

They collected the electricity bill and analyzed their previous consumption

They revisited the place after few weeks to find out if their neighbours are successful on reducing their electricity consumption.

They later again analyzed the final data and gave its report.

Awareness campaign reached 100 families.

Notebook binding & distribution

Volunteers collected their unused paper from used notebook and made hand bound notebooks from the same. 150 books are made.

Notebooks submitted by volunteers were gathered and will be distributed to the needy people. Distribution will be carried out in April

Assistance to Special children

- For last ten years college is helping the NGO Hi Tech Foundation for the assistance to the special children. The tricolour badges prepared by special children are sold by the NSS volunteers.

- National Flags of paper, made by physically challenged children were distributed around college campus and surrounding on the occasion of Independence Day 2010. In all 1200 flags were distributed.

Tribal

- Rapling activity was carried out at giri vanavasi pragati mandal school, at dhundal wadi, dahanu on 20th December, 2010. About 100 school kids participated in this adventure. Also same benefit was given to about 25 students of Somaiya nursing college on next day.
- Lecture on uses of Internet was given to school children and their teachers by volunteer arsalan Jamali and Suraj Ghimire.
- 20 computers were repaired by our volunteers in the month of January, 2011 by working on weekends at Dahanu. This has helped a lot to the said school, as nearly 450 tribal children can now avail these machines which were earlier idle.
- A rapling activity was arranged at our tribal school at Naresh wadi and about 100 school kids were given the benefit. Few of our volunteers visited Naresh wadi on weekends in January and through their consistent efforts, about 20 computers have been made functional. These computers were non functional and therefore not available for the school kids earlier
- Courage building of tribal children was achieved through adventurous activities under guidance of volunteer Dhanashri Kolambkar, and Ex volunteer Jagdish Rajane.
- District level selection for RD parade was held in K. J. Somaiya college of Arts and Commerce in which 3 volunteers took part. Two of these were selected. Ex volunteer Jagdish Rajane was involved as trainer and judge. Sis. Dhanashri Kolambkar as well as Bro. Hardik nayak attended further selection camps for state level and zonal level
- Volunteers Yashwant Sharma, Sagar Vidhate, Manisha Panda and Ravindra Kapadne attended two days workshop on HIV/AIDS Awareness held by MDACS at Wadala on 30th and 31st July, 2010.
- Three volunteers, Sagar Vidhate, Darshan Pande and Pragati Gore attended the Leadership training program in September 2010. All three have contributed a lot in the NSS activities.
- Two volunteers, Suraj Ghimire and Pooja Nimbalkar participated in the West Zone Camp at Golap, Ratnagiri which was held during 26th dec 2010 – 2nd jan 2011

- Dhanashri kolambkar worked as trainer during pre RD parade camp held at kalina campus during 16th-25th January, 2011. Also three volunteers, Hardik nayak, Sushant Chavan and Asmita Jadhav helped as residential volunteers throughout the camp. Ex District coordinator, Prof. D. G. Phondekar was in charge of the said camp.
- Volunteer Poulomi Biswas participated in 5 day university level residential camp held at Neral during 13th-18th January, 2011
- 11 volunteers participated in Peace rally organized by Sarvodaya Mandal on 6th august,2010
- 15 volunteers participated in the gathering and pledge on international peace day.
- 30 volunteers participated in Youth Café events at Mithibai College and Physical Education college at wadala on 28th and 29th December

Save Environment / Tree Plantation

- World Environment Day was celebrated in the College. The lectures by eminent experts were organized . Many volunteers from the colleges in Central Suburban District attended the programme.
- Seeds spray at yeoor village in Thane District, in June and July.
- Seeds spray at Mumbra hills in July.

Disha Deepshika

- Project taken up by NSS in three wards of Mumbai for the benefit of teen agers deprived of school/college and specially girls. It was taken in collaboration with UNICEF, NAIR Hospital, MDACS and AAMRAI, an NGO.

20 volunteers were deployed from our college and their work has been appreciated.

A meeting was organized at D.T.T.S. College, Malad for planning of the project. It was attended by the program officer and student volunteer. Another follow up meeting in Nair hospital was also attended by PO and vol. Suraj Gimire.

First phase was held between 9th-14th August 2010. Students interacted with various RRC's and CBO's in Kurla 'L ward'

Volunteers carried out Awareness program through street plays in the second phase between 26th Nov 2010 to 1st Dec 2010. They were also involved in IEC material preparation at Sathye college.

Survey was carried out by Volunteers in the third phase between 13th Dec 2010 to 18th Dec 2010.

Also a survey was carried out which will be used for micro planning.

They visited several Red Ribbon clubs and community organizations and carried out awareness of HIV/AIDS.

At the end of each phase, a presentation was given by selected volunteers. Vedangi Amnekar and Suraj Ghimire were involved in this activity.

Malaria Awareness Campaign

- An orientation was held in S.k. Somaiya College of Arts, commerce and science, attended by our volunteers. They were instructed by Doctors from GMMC
- Laxmi Nagar Slum area was allotted to our volunteers for survey and awareness, in this phase volunteers carried out the said work along with GMMC's staff. water purification using chlorine tablets was also done. Awareness was made door to door.
- Awareness in the form of rallies was carried out in the last week of October, in which Volunteers participated.
- Twenty five volunteers successfully completed the project and were given certificates by united way.
- Beneficiaries were Residents of Laxmi Nagar, Ghatkopar of L ward

Save Water

- Street plays were prepared and presented during Ganesh Utsav at several localities of Asalfa Village.
- Some street plays were also presented in villages near Dhundhulwadi, Dahanu road, during residential camp in December 2010.
- About 300 families in Asalfa village and the families in Residents of Dhundulwadi and Halad Pada (about 200) have received the benefit of the activities.

Voters Awareness Campaign

- The chief election Commissioner declared 25th January as Voters' day.
- A street play was prepared by our 20 volunteers and was presented at seven places in thane district including thane city as well as Bhayender on 24th Jan 2011. A demo of the street play was shown to Shree Pratap Jadhav, officer at CPS, court naka on 20th Jan 2011.
- A Street play was also performed within the campus for the benefit of Students in the Campus.

Blood Donation

- Blood donation drive in our college was organized on 30th June 2010. 84 students had donated blood. Thalassemia test was organized for blood donors on same day in collaboration with NGO THINK foundation.
- Campaigning for blood donation was organized by our volunteers throughout the campus inspiring students to donate the blood.
- Thalassemia report and Blood donor certificate was distributed in August 2010.

Residential camp

The residential camp was organised between 16th – 22nd December, 2010 at Nareshwadi in Dahanu taluka of Thane district.

Thirty volunteers of the first year have participated in the camp

The program officers of three colleges in Somaiya campus had a meeting at Naresh wadi, Dahanu with local authorities and it was planned to take chain camps in the month of December. Our camp was held in third week of December.

The **objectives** of the camp were

1. Awareness of Tribal region to the Mumbai students
2. Inculcation of skills like dignity of labour, public relationship, interpersonal communication etc.
3. Observation of government rubber plantation project at Dapchari, Dahanu.
4. Learning vermi-culture, and dairy activities at Nareshwadi.
5. Assistance to tribal students in the academic routine and development of some skills through which the development of bridge between urban and rural youth can be achieved.
6. Understanding about the social evils in the tribal community

In the fulfilment of the goals following activities were conducted in the camp

Shramanubhav - Volunteers dug and widened rigs around trees. Nearly 100 trees were covered.

Courage building of tribal children was achieved through adventurous activities (rapling). About 100 school kids were benefitted.

Academic assistance to tribal students - Volunteers helped the school kids by giving them information about use of internet in interactive lectures.

Repair of lab computers - It was found that there were 60 PCs which were non-functional. Our volunteers took the task and repaired a few. This was then continued on weekends in the month of January and 20 computers are now functional. The principal of the school, shri. Pawar Sir has appreciated the efforts of our volunteers in a letter to our principal.

Awareness about social issues - Volunteers prepared five street plays covering various social issues like dowry, alcoholism, tobacco consumption health and hygiene and presented in the nearby hamlets like Haladipada, Dhundulwadi and Narashwadi hostel students.

Development of skills – students have organised exhibition and snake show in which snake handling was organised. For the development of courage, decision making, team building rappelling exercise was conducted for the Nareshwadi students.

Awareness lectures -

Lectures by Dr. Telange and shri. Prashant Savant were arranged.

Volunteers visited nearby dam at kurze.

Volunteers observed vermiculture plant and dairy at wadi.

Exercises, cultural programs and group discussions were held every day. Each student was involved in cooking on at least one day and students enhanced their management skills, communication skills through the camp activities. Exposure to rural life has made them aware about social issues and of their responsibilities towards the society.

NSS

Intercollegiate competitions:

- 10 Volunteers participated in ‘Yuva Astra’, an intercollegiate event by SIWS college, wadala on 15th and 16th Dec 2010. They participated in Quiz, essay, Rangoli, Group singing Elocution and Debate.

- 15 Volunteers participated in ‘Udaant, an intercollegiate event by Khalsa College, Matunga on 15th and 16th Jan 2011. They participated in various competition like Debate, Elocution, essay, streetplay, rangoli and Powerpoint presentation. Group of Sis Priyanka Kothwale and Sis Ruchira Tipnis won first prize for power-point presentation.
- 20 volunteers participated in an intercollegiate event by Kirti College on 24th and 25th Jan 2011. They participated in different competition like Quiz, Storytelling, group dance and Rangoli. Bro. Suraj Ghimire won Third prize for Story Telling Competitions.

The NCC cadets have participated in a number of activities throughout the year.

I Hospital Attachment Camp

A hospital attachment camp was conducted by 1 MAH Girls’ BN at Devlali in Nashik from 22 July – 2 Aug, 2010. Ten girl cadets from various colleges participated in the camp. JUO. Vishakha Devkar represented our college in the camp. The cadets were trained for the medical treatment and various aids provided to the soldiers and civilians in case of emergencies.

II Independence Day Programme

Independence Day programme was organized in the college campus on 15 Aug., 2010. Vice President of Somaiya Vidyavihar, Shri Sameer Somaiya was the Ho’nble chief guest for the function. CSUO. Ruchi Pandya was the Parade commander under whose command a guard of honour was given to our national flag followed by the national anthem. Principal Dr. Vijay Joshi then briefly addressed the gathering.

III Cleaning the oil spills caused by the ship “K.K.Chitra”

The oil spills caused by the cargo ship K.K. Chitra resulted in a huge damage being caused to the flora and fauna along the Mumbai coast. Our NCC cadets participated actively in the cleanliness program undertaken by Mumbai 'B' group. Eight hundred cadets from all the three wings participated in the cleanliness drive on 21 Aug, 2010 at Colaba. In order to avoid getting affected by the poisonous chemical waste, gumboots, hand gloves and polythene bags were provided to the cadets.

IV Ganesh Visarjan

The NCC cadets played an important role in controlling the crowd and maintaining the peace at the Girgaon chowpati during Ganpati visarjan on 15 ,16 ,17 and 22 Sept., 2010. The cadets, in a well co-ordinated manner, guided the crowd and helped them in parking their vehicles. The efforts of the cadets were appreciated by the people as well as the police for their help in controlling the traffic.

V Cleanup Activity at Juhu Beach (GreenGanesha)

After the Ganesh festival, a lot of waste is generated along the beaches of Mumbai due to the visarjan activity. With an aim to prevent pollution of water due to this waste, a cleanliness drive on the Juhu beach, was organized on 23 Sept., 2010. NCC cadets from all the wings- Air, Naval and Army participated in the program. Our cadets also participated enthusiastically in the cleanliness drive and did their part of duty in preventing pollution in our city.

Thal Sena Camp 2010

Two of our NCC cadets, CJUO. Priyanka Mestry and CJUO. Gauri More were selected for the National level prestigious Thal Sena Camp conducted at the Delhi cantonment from 23rd Oct., to 3 Nov., 2010.

The cadets had to undergo rigorous army training in different camps to be a part of the forty girl team which represented Maharashtra. It included various subjects like firing, map-reading, health and hygiene, obstacles training etc.

VII National Integration Camp

CQMS. Mansi Puro and SGT. Darshana Shinde participated and represented Maharashtra at the National Integration Camp conducted in N.G.Acharya College in Chembur from 2 – 13 Nov., 2010. Our cadets successfully completed the camp by participating actively in various cultural activities under the helpful guidance of camp commandant Col.M.K.Joshi.
